What I'm Praying for This Rosh Hashana

Each year I sit back and try to focus my Rosh Hashana preparations in a specific area. Some years I focus on my interpersonal relations and how to improve in that area. Other years I think about my relation with G-d and how I can improve in that arena. As a rabbi, I also contemplate how I can better serve the needs of our Beth Zion community. I'm never lacking areas for self-improvement. Given the amount of time we spend over the High Holiday period praying, that is certainly an area that requires focus and attention. Israel is always in my mind and in my heart as well, especially in the most recent weeks.

As I pen these words, Israel is in crisis. A very different crisis than last summer, when rockets shot from Gaza were landing in Israel. Today's crisis is coming from within.

"Jewish terrorists," "Jewish extremists," "Jewish enemies." These are the terms that I can think of to describe the network of Jewish fanatics who recently threw a Molotov cocktail at a Palestinian home, killing 18-month-old infant Ali Dawabasha, his father, and critically wounding his mother and brother.

When the Shin Bet, Israel's Security Service, captured one of the group's leaders, they discovered a document that he wrote entitled The Rebel Manifesto. As painful as the following words may be, allow me to quote from the document:

"The idea of the rebellion is very simple. Israel has many weak points, many issues which it handles by walking on eggshells so as to not attract attention. What we're going to do is simply fire up these powder kegs. The aim is to bring down the state, to bring down its structure and its ability to control and to build a new system. To do it, we must act outside the rules of the state we seek to bring down."

While it is enticing to ignore these words as the rant of a deranged, unbalanced individual, we clearly do not have the luxury to do so. The same group has been linked to church burnings in Israel that have damaged Vatican-Israeli relations. They have also firebombed and set their targets on an institution that I hold very close to my heart, the Hand-in-Hand school system where I have volunteered and advised on numerous times over the past year. Finally, we cannot disregard their impact; little Ali was murdered together with his father.

So I am scared. In fact I am more afraid this summer than I was last summer as rockets were being launched daily from Gaza. I am fearful because I have always believed that we had one enemy, and that they were clearly identifiable. I was certain



that with the right military or diplomatic approach we, as Jews, could handle the situation. This is considerably more complicated.

Whether this group is a few or many - and most security experts believe their numbers are greater than originally believed - they do not represent authentic Jewish values. I do not advocate, "turning the other cheek," when we are attacked, but I do preach and passionately believe that there is a path to peace if we are truly committed to achieving it. The path I believe in is one of a balanced approach where we engage in meaningful negotiations and peace gestures while maintaining a very strong military to protect Israel. I also believe in supporting the government and not acting in a vigilante manner.

Our Torah and tradition teaches us that Rosh Hashana is an opportunity to start fresh and new and to change our destiny. There is no such thing as predetermination; we have the ability to create a better tomorrow for ourselves, our families and for our beloved State of Israel.

All of the Rosh Hashana prayers that we recite reflect one theme, a better future. An enhanced future on a national level and on an individual level. My prayers will be focused on next year being a better year. A year full of blessing, success, health, happiness and prosperity. I will also be praying that Israel should take steps towards building a long-term peace agreement with the Palestinians that will allow us to sleep at night without fear. I will also be praying for those misguided zealots who need to be stopped before they do something that can cause irreparable damage to Israel and to the peace process. And of course, my thoughts and prayers will be focused on the Jewish nation as a whole, wherever they may be.

In this issue of the Pillar there are many exciting events and programs scheduled: Our "Fall Lecture Series," traditional Torah study, "Lunch & Learn," "Tot Shabbat," our Cantorial Concert and family activities for the holidays. Of course there is also the Beth Zion Bar & Bat Mitzva Israel trip that is highlighted as well. Beth Zion is a vibrant active synagogue. Whether you join us for the holidays, an event, a class or a lecture, Beth Zion is your synagogue and the door is always open. I look forward to greeting you over the holidays and whenever you join us for an event.

On behalf of Raizie and myself I want to wish each and every one of you a Shana Tova, a Sweet, Happy & Health New Year.

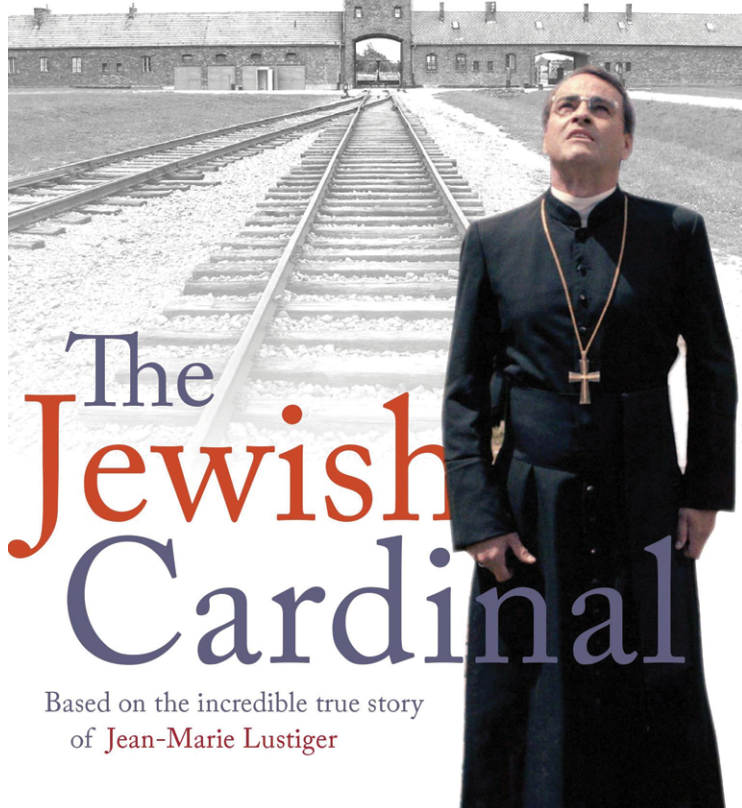

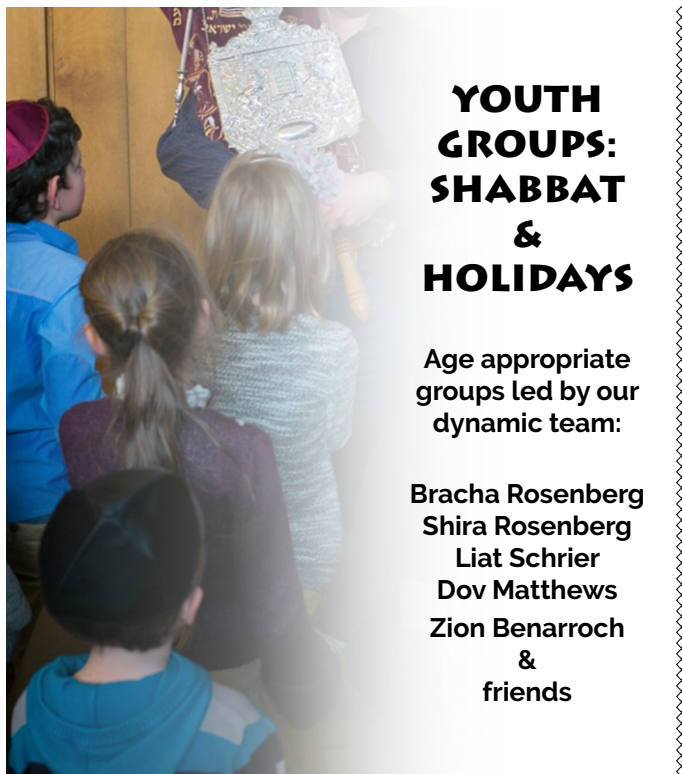

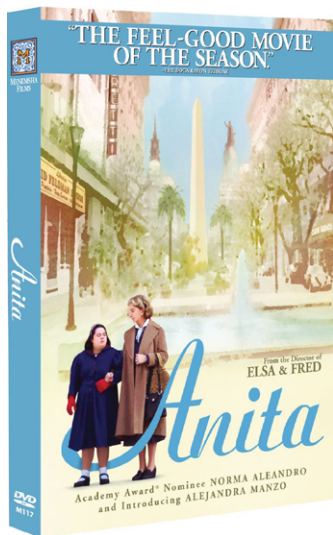
