Dear Beth Zion Family,

How is this Rosh Hashana different from all other Rosh Hashanas? For one, as we approach the high holiday season, our thoughts and prayers are with our brothers and sisters in Israel. We cannot stop thinking of our hostages who are still being held captive somewhere in the tunnels of Gaza. We pray for their safe return. We pray for the brave men and women of the IDF who protect the State of Israel. We pray for the northern residents of Israel who have been displaced from their homes the past 11 months.

One of the central prayers on Rosh Hashana is "Avinu Malkeinu", our father our king. This prayer is reserved for specific times during the year when we especially ask G-d to invoke mercy and compassion towards the Jewish people. It is said on fast days and during the 10 days of penitence between Rosh Hashana and Yom Kippur. Since October 7th, many

communities around the world have been reciting this prayer on a daily basis.

At Beth Zion, we have not stopped and continue to pray and invoke G-ds' mercy on behalf of the Jewish people. The carpets throughout the building will be shampooed and cleaned prior to the High Holy Days.


